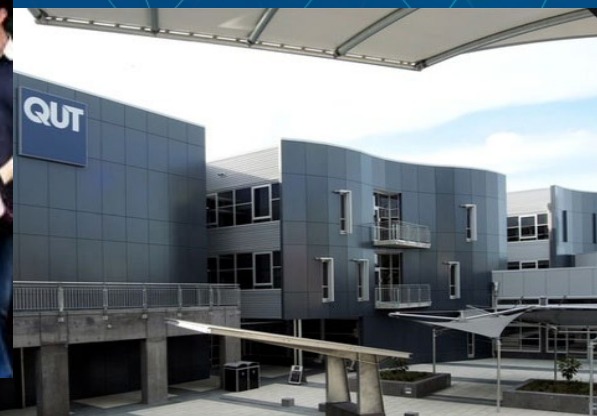
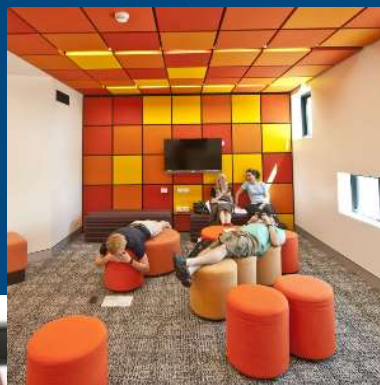

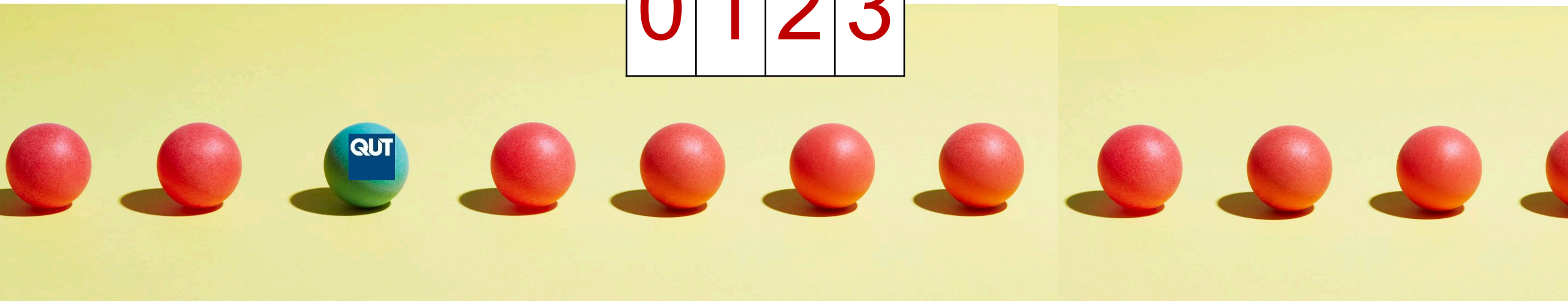

Bachelor of Nursing – Graduate Entry

- 3 years full time
- Graduate entry pathway
- Academic Entry Requirements:
 - Recognised non-nursing Bachelors with a gpa of 4.0 in no more than 10 yrs from NS42 commencement date
 - Recognised overseas nursing Bachelors enabling students to work as a RN in home country. Degrees awarded more than 10 yrs require recent work experience as a RN
- English language requirements from July 2020: IELTS 7 (7) to meet ANMAC revised English standards
- First provider of tertiary Nursing education in Qld - 40 yrs (1978)
- One of the largest School of Nursing in Australia
- Semester of Entry: February and July

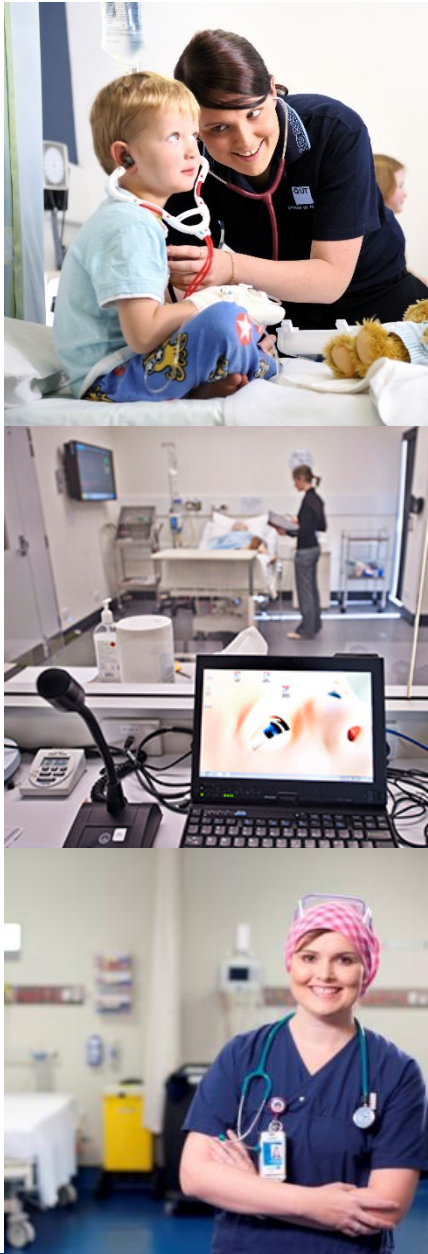

Placements in B Nursing

- **840 hours** of external clinical placements from Year 1 to final year in a variety of settings
 - NSB010 or NSB131 – 2 weeks – basic nursing care
 - NSB232 – 3 weeks
 - NSB 233 – 2 x 2 weeks
 - NSB 334 – 1 x 2 weeks + 1 x 4 weeks
 - NSB 335 – 6 weeks
- Students **perform duties as a registered nurse** under supervision
- External placements undertaken concurrently with on-campus clinical training
- Supported by Clinical Facilitators
- Other Support Services – e.g. assistance from senior students

Medical Laboratory Scientists

Bachelor of Medical Laboratory Science

- Medical laboratory scientists perform tests on human and vet samples. The results of these tests are used to diagnose 100 per cent of cancers and assist with clinical decisions – choice of treatment.
- **CAREER:** Medical laboratory scientists within the pathology industry – a private laboratory or hospital
- **QUT MLS program is accredited by AIMS** – higher chance of employment and better paid. On average, the course has >95% graduate employment rate.

12-week professional placement in accredited pathology labs and research facilities.

- **Block exemptions :** 1-year advanced standing for completion of a diploma or 1 year of Bachelor degree study in Health Science or Science with subjects in
 - molecular biology, and
 - chemistry, and
 - Anatomy or physiology or pharmacology, and
 - Mathematics or statistics or physics.
- Pre-requisites: Maths & Chemistry

Psychologists

Bachelor of Behavioural Science (Psychology)

- For students interested in the study of the mind and behaviour (how people think, feel and react to situations) and strategies to improve psychological functioning.
- **CAREER:** To become a registered psychologist, students must also complete postgraduate studies – 1 year Honours + 2 years work experience or recognised further study (e.g. M Psychology. Total 6 years).
- The program also offers students an opportunity to progress into Honours (Psychology) to work towards becoming a qualified practising psychologist. **Package offer:** 3-year B Behavioural Sc (Psychology) for Feb + 1-year Honours (Psychology) for Feb ; automatic package offers for international Year 12 in Australia.
- **Work integrated learning** and a minor in counselling available.
- Other careers in education, human resources, market research, policing, organisational development.
- Semester of Entry: February & July

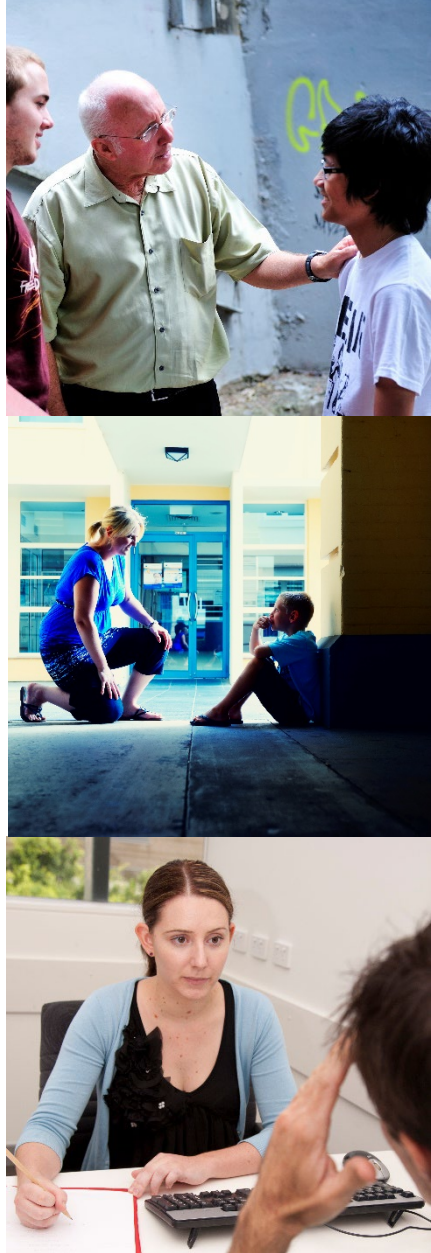

Master of Social Work – Qualifying

Minimum Academic Requirements

- A completed recognised Bachelor degree (or higher) and the equivalent of at least one year of full-time studies in social sciences, for example, studies in society, human development, education, human services, law, media & communication, psychology, sociology or urban & regional planning.



Course Duration: 2 years – 1000 hours of supervised field placements

Professional Recognition

- Graduates are eligible for membership of the Australian Association of Social Workers.



Health Services Managers

Master of Health Management

For students interested in **management of health care + efficient & effective delivery of health services.**

Minimum Academic Requirements

- A completed **recognised Bachelor** degree (or higher) in any discipline.

Course Duration: 2 years

Specialisations: Emergency & Disaster Management, Health Law, Health Policy & Planning, Health Services Innovations, Quality & Patient Safety, Cross-specialisation. (Specialisation is not part of the award title and not on parchment.) Opportunity to undertake PUN704 **Health Management Internship** in a health service or health policy organisation

Public Health Professionals

Master of Public Health

Public Health professionals promote population health and wellbeing in service areas such as food safety, disease control, prevention programs, health promotion and environmental health.

Career Outcomes: Health promotion practitioners work in the **public sector, community agencies , international health aid organisations, professional workplaces** (e.g. National Heart Foundation, Diabetes Australia, Cancer Council, WHO) and in private industry . **Graduates of the masters program who have successfully completed 48 credit point dissertation may apply for entry to Master of Applied Science (Research) or the Doctor of Philosophy.**

Minimum Entry Requirements

- A completed completed **recognised Bachelor degree** (or higher) in any discipline plus IELTS 6.5 (6)
- Graduate Certificate in Communication for Health pathway available

Environmental Health Officers

Master of Health, Safety and Environment

Environmental Health Subject Area

Academic entry requirements:

- A completed recognised Bachelor degree (or higher) in any discipline and
- A minimum of 48 credit points (equivalent of one semester of full time study) of basic science units that were completed at the Bachelor degree level.

Course Duration: 2 years

Semester of Entry: February

(Graduate Diploma in Environmental Health available in February)

Career Outcomes:

- Environmental Health Officers **promote healthy environments & manage environmental factors that affects human health** e.g. climate change, soil contamination, water & food safety, waste and dangerous chemicals management. Most positions in the public sector.

Professional recognition:

- **G/Dip accredited by Environmental Health Australia and graduates are eligible to practise as environmental health officers.**





International Merit Scholarship from 2021

- Amount: 25% of tuition fee for students' first year of degree study at QUT
- Number of awards: Unlimited
- Eligibility
 - Meet academic entry requirements of the specified Health program and have achieved the published scholarship requirements, e.g. GCE A Level aggregate 12 points over best 3 subjects
 - Meet the minimum English language requirements
